The Reluctant Mr. Darwin by David Quammen (an intimate view of Darwin, a short, enjoyable read)

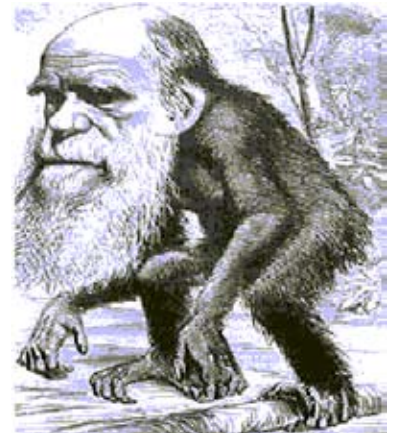
