Join us for an adventure with pirates in history, in our imaginations, and in our lives. From ancient times to today's news. From Plutarch to CNN. From the Barbary Coast and the Spanish

Main to the Malabar Coast of India, the Straits of Malacca in Indonesia, and the South China Sea. Together we will look for common causes of piracy over the centuries and consider the ways people and governments have fought them.

But wait.. if these are such bad guys why do we romanticize them in literature, in film, in our imaginations? Robert Louis Stevenson had a lot to do with it but it started much earlier. Our second session will look at this curious phenomenon, from Lord Byron to Johnny Depp, and give us an opportunity to sit back and enjoy some first rate

swashbuckling with Erroll Flynn and others. Our third session will bring us back to the present reality of piracy in Somalia. We'll take a serious look at this recent and fast-changing situation. What are its causes? (Do we recognize them from the past?) What are the trends? What are the legal issues? Should piracy be treated as terrorism or as a crime? What is being done? Is it working?

Biography

Three years ago Peter was in the Seychelles on a French ship that had been hijacked by Somali pirates the year before. The captain's first-hand story, which you will hear, generated the interest for this subject.

He returned to Cincinnati for the second half of his career, now as an internal consultant on advertising and strategy—a kind of guru position he found both useful and enjoyable.
