THE SPANISH CIVIL WAR

1936 - 1939

Many historians believe that the victory of Fascism in Spain in 1939 not only set the stage for World War II but was actually the beginning of the greater war which began in earnest just five months later. The Spanish Civil War was the first really violent clash between the two opposing forces that had evolved in Europe since the end of World War I: Josef Stalin's Communism and Fascism as produced by Hitler and Mussolini.

Our three sessions will tell a comprehensive story of the war beginning with the formation of the opposing sides. The land owners, capitalists, the military, and the church on the Fascist side were led by General Franco, as opposed to the workers and peasants who were organized by the Socialists, Communists, and Anarchists in the Spanish Republic. We will meet the leaders of the opposing sides. The Reds got massive military

aid from Stalin as the Fascists did from Hitler and Mussolini. The Fascists were almost able to win the war in the first three months but the planes and tanks that Stalin sent in and the Communist-organized International Brigades were able to stop the Fascists at the gates of Madrid at the last minute. We will



discuss how Madrid became the focal point for idealists, writers, poets, and filmmakers of the left. Franco's army had better tactics and training with equally good weapons and they were either victorious in most of the battles with the Reds or, at the least, lost fewer troops and less equipment if retreat was unavoidable.

It took almost two years for Franco's forces to split the Republic in half; however, the surrender of Madrid and the total collapse of the Reds came quickly with over half a million men, women, and children fleeing into France where they were put into concentration camps.

General Franco built an incredible memorial just north of Madrid after the war and Dr. George Frakes will give us a brief presentation on "The Valley of the Fallen" at the end of the third session.

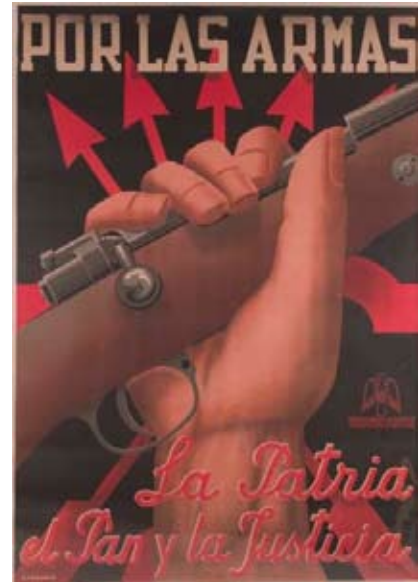
