



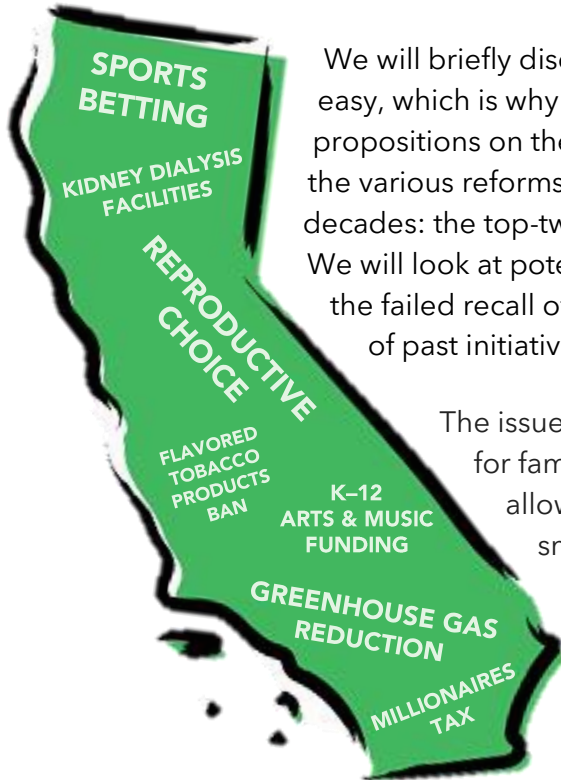
# Propositions on the California November Ballot

We will briefly discuss how a proposition gets on the ballot – it is astonishingly easy, which is why we have so many each election – and then discuss the seven propositions on the November 2022 ballot. We will also evaluate the impact of the various reforms to the state election system implemented in the last two decades: the top-two primary election system and reapportionment reform. We will look at potential reforms of the recall that have been discussed since the failed recall of Governor Newsom in 2021 and the controversial impacts of past initiatives that the voters approved.

The issues in this election are broad, ranging from placing protections for family planning and abortion in the state constitution to where to allow betting on sports matches (at Indian casinos or from any smartphone), additional funding for arts and music education in the public schools, requiring on-site medical professionals at kidney dialysis facilities (yet again), taxing millionaires to fund greenhouse-gas-reducing initiatives, and a referendum challenging the state law prohibiting the retail sale of flavored tobacco products.

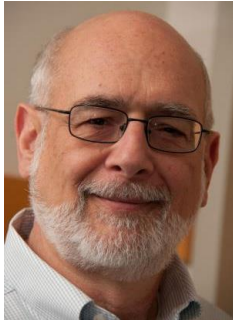
