The bible has been one of the foundational documents of western civilization for two millennia. We still take civil oaths with bible under hand. In the last century, new discoveries in archeology, languages, and anthropology of the ancient middle east have forced a reevaluation of the bible and its meanings.

The Old Testament account of the exodus of the Israelites from Egypt, their wanderings through the wilderness, and their conquest of Canaan includes numerous details—theological, political, historical, and social—that are difficult to reconcile with what we can infer from other written sources. Who wrote that account and when? Is the narrative historically reliable? When did it happen if ever? What people and how many were involved? How was Canaan "conquered"? Is Moses a historical figure? This presentation will explore these and related issues. The orientation will be a treatment of the biblical text in the same way scholars might treat any complex work of historical literature that is the product of several authors who lived at different times and wrote with differing purposes.

**Norm Cohen** received a B.A. in chemistry at Reed College followed by an M.A. in mathematics and a Ph.D. in chemistry at UC Berkeley. From 1963 to 1996 he worked as a research chemist at Aerospace Corp. in El Segundo. After he and his family relocated to Portland, he taught general freshman chemistry and environmental science at several different local colleges and universities. Concurrently his growing interest in traditional music, mainly American, led to half a dozen books, more than 50 book chapters and journal articles, and the editing of some two dozen albums of various genres of American traditional music. During the past 15 years he has been exploring different topics in biblical literature, which has led to over a dozen different seminars on various aspects of both the Old and New Testaments, mostly in Green Valley, AZ, but also for OLLI at CSU-CI.
