



Filmmakers John Ferry and Grace De Soto will discuss the making of their award-winning documentary Sitting Bull: A Stone in My Heart, which will be screened at the class (approximately 55 min.). The film makes extensive use of firstperson narration taken from Sitting Bull's own words, giving the viewer an intimate portrait of one of America's great historical figures, who was not only the most powerful Indian chief of the Northern Plains but also a great warrior, spiritual leader, and skilled diplomat. Sitting Bull's words, along with a narrator's historical perspective, over six hundred archival photographs and images, and a compelling original music score bring to life the story of a great man's struggle to maintain his people's way of life against the ever-expanding westward movement of White settlers.

Under his own banner, LilliMar Pictures, he produced and directed Sitting Bull: A Stone in My Heart, Contrary Warrior, Makin' It, Taking Alcatraz, In a Small Town, and Blood of Our Brothers. He has a B.A. in Theater Arts and an M.A. in Cinema, and he is the author of The Horse in the Field, North of Marfa, Rainy Night in Georgia, and A Simple Place. He has been a Santa Barbara resident since 1994.

GRACE DE SOTO is the co-producer and co-writer of *Sitting Bull: A Stone in My Heart*, her first effort as a producer and writer. She has since produced and written four other non-fiction features, *Contrary Warrior: The Life and Times of Adam Fortunate Eagle, Makin' It, Taking Alcatraz,* and *Blood of Our Brothers.* She is the author of two books of short stories: *Hey Guy This Is the Butterfly* and *Crows on the Line.* Grace attended the Art Center School of Design in Los Angeles and now lives in Santa Barbara with her husband, John Ferry.
