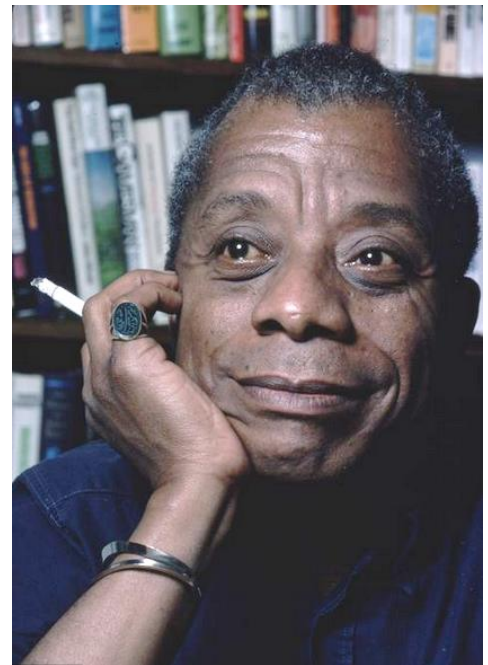

James Baldwin (1924–1987) wrote novels, short stories, plays, and essays which depicted the *subjective experience* of Black people. Through his numerous talks, interviews, debates, and presence at civil rights marches, he became the national spokesperson about “this nation’s crisis of white people not seeing Negroes as human beings, while ignoring the moral failure of historic white violence toward Negroes and the mythology of white people’s superiority.”

Video clips of Baldwin’s talks and passages from his fiction and essays will illustrate his eloquence, charisma, and lasting influence.

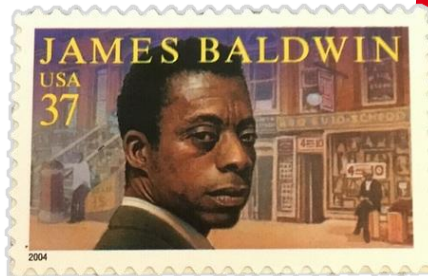
